

Tourist Attraction

Mamallapuram (also known as **Mahabalipuram**), is one of the famous tourist sites in India. It is 23 km drive from Muttukadu and is best known for the UNESCO World Heritage Site of 7th- and 8th-century Hindu Group of Monuments at Mahabalipuram. The ancient name of the place is Thirukadalmalai. The site is managed by the Archaeological Survey of India. Some important structures include: (a) Descent of the Ganges or Arjuna's Penance – a giant open-air rock relief. (b) Pancha Rathas (Five Chariots) – five monolithic pyramidal structures named after the Pandavas (Arjuna, Bhima, Yudhishtira, Nakula and Sahadeva) and Draupadi. Each of these is carved from one single separate large piece of stone. (c) Cave Temples – over ten rock-cut temples dating back to the 7th century. These include the Varaha, Adi Varaha, Krishna, Mahishasuramardini (Durga), Ramanuja, Dharmaraja, Koneri, Kotikal, Panchapandava and others. (d) The Shore Temple – a structural temple along the Bay of Bengal with the entrance from the western side away from the sea. Recent excavations have revealed new structures here. (e) Other structural temples including the Olakkanesvara temple and the lighthouse, along with rock-cut features such as the Draupadi's tank and Krishna's Butterball. (f) Thirukadalmalai, the temple dedicated to Lord Vishnu.

The Tamil Nadu Veterinary and Animal Sciences University blossomed on 20.09.1989 as the first Veterinary University of the country, through the Tamil Nadu State Government Act 42 of 1989. The seed for the establishment and growth of TANUVAS was sown as early as 1876, when the Madras Veterinary College was started as an Agricultural School in Chennai to offer diploma and certificate course in the field of veterinary and animal sciences. At present, TANUVAS has a total of seven Veterinary Colleges, a College of Food and Dairy Technology, a College of Poultry Production and Management, 10 Research Farms, 15 Research Laboratories and Diagnostic Centers, 20 Veterinary University Training and Research Centers, three Farmers' Training Centers, and four Krishi Vigyan Kendra. NIRF ranking of TANUVAS for the year 2025 is 1st among State Veterinary Universities and 26th among Agricultural and Allied Institutions.



The Madras Veterinary College (MVC), the oldest of the constituent units of TANUVAS, was started as an equine treatment school with five students in a temporary structure at Saidapet, Chennai in 1903. It is one of the oldest veterinary schools in the country. Since inception, the college started growing in stature and is now recognized as a premier veterinary institute in the country and world over. The college is located at

Vepery near Chennai Central in nearly 6 ha. of land. The main administrative block is a heritage building built on the Indo-Saracenic architecture. As a founder unit started in 1903 serving as a core department of this 118 year old Madras Veterinary College, the Veterinary Clinical Medicine Department is an

educational department of international eminence. During the founding years it was christened then as Therapeutics and Materia medica and later developed with modern facilities and christened as the Department of Clinical Medicine and Therapeutics. Currently this Department has been recognized by ICAR as a Centre of Advanced Faculty Training (CAFT) since 2010. The major objectives of this department are to offer UG and PG education, to undertake problem-oriented research and to impart training on advanced diagnostic procedures and imaging towards diseases diagnosis and prevention to the academicians, researchers and practicing veterinarians from institutes of India.
